1. Introduction

One of the main objectives of FIFA, the French Football Association and the Local Organising Committee is to ensure that disabled people and people with limited mobility can enjoy a barrier-free environment alongside their fellow supporters at the FIFA Women's World Cup France 2019™.

As part of these efforts, we have developed this guide to provide disabled people and people with limited mobility helpful information to make their matchday experience as accessible as possible. We hope that you find the Spectators Accessibility Guide useful and we wish you an enjoyable and inclusive FIFA Women's World Cup France 2019™ across all nine Host Cities: Grenoble, Le Havre, Lyon, Montpellier, Nice, Paris, Reims, Rennes and Valenciennes.

The purpose of this guide is to provide information to disabled people and people with limited mobility in order to allow them to enjoy the event. Please note that this guide contains information from sources external to FIFA and was last updated in May 2019. The authors are not responsible for any changes that may occur after the publication of this guide. If you need additional information, please do not hesitate to visit the websites of the external sources; links are provided at the end of this document.



2. How do I get tickets?

2.1 What to do

Special Access Tickets

Special Access Tickets (SATs) are a dedicated allocation of tickets for purchase for disabled people and people with limited mobility. There are three types of SATs:

- ▶ **Wheelchair user places:** These tickets are only for users of wheelchairs and mobility scooters designed for transportation of disabled people and people with limited mobility.
- ▶ **Easy-Access Amenity Seats:** These tickets are for people with limited mobility who do not use wheelchairs but are unable to bend their knees or need more room to access their seats using a walking aid or crutches. Amenity seats also provide extra space for disabled people with assistance dogs. Whenever possible, these seats have minimal step-access.
- ▶ **Standard Easy-access Seats:** These tickets are for people with limited mobility who do not need a wheelchair user place but require seating with minimal step-access (2-3 steps) that is close to accessible amenities (e.g. accessible toilets)

To buy Standard Easy Access or Easy Access Amenity tickets, follow the same procedure as described below. You just need to answer “No” to the question “Wheelchair user” and state in the “Further information” box what specific assistance you require. Only holders of proof of eligibility will be entitled to a free seat for one companion.

If you have a temporary injury and will require accessible seating during the time of the event, you can contact tickets@loc2019.fr and explain your needs so that we can assess this and offer you relevant seating (subject to availability).

Disabled people and people with limited mobility who wish to reserve tickets must present proof of disability. This can be:


- ▶ A disability card
- ▶ A priority card
- ▶ A medical certificate
- ▶ Another document commonly accepted in your country of residence. This document must be presented either at the box-office window or attached to the online form. It must be legible and still be valid on the matchday or day of the event.





2.2 Our services

Parking spaces

Requests for a parking space will only be approved after examination and verification of the attached supporting documents. Access to the car park is also subject to verification of these documents.

There is a limited number of parking spaces at each stadium are available for SAT holders. These spaces will be available from customer services upon request, subject to availability, when you buy your ticket. Parking spaces for SAT holders are as close as possible to the stadium, while taking into account security issues specific to the event. Detailed information for each stadium is provided below.

Companions

The purchase of a special access ticket entitles a disabled person or person with limited mobility to a ticket for a companion; seats will be as close as possible to each other. Additional tickets for people who are not disabled will need to be paid for.

If you wish, volunteers will be able to help you to find your seat upon arrival at the stadium and/or leave the stadium.

Wheelchairs

For your convenience, a Wheelchair User Ticket provides a space free of obstacles for a wheelchair that is brought to the stadium by the Wheelchair User Ticketholder. **To avoid any difficulties, please come to the stadium with a wheelchair. We are not able to provide you with a chair or wheelchair during the match due to stadium infrastructure and operational needs.**

For safety and security as well as operational reasons, manual or electric wheelchairs and mobility scooters need to fulfil certain basic requirements: they can have either 3 or 4 wheels; the maximum dimensions are 700mm wide and 1300mm long; the maximum turning radius is 900mm; the maximum turning width is 1500mm; and their maximum speed must be 6 km/h.

The volunteers who are there to help disabled people or people with limited mobility will have a limited number of wheelchairs to help you get to your seat. As a reminder, these wheelchairs are provided only in order to allow you to access your seat and not for the entire time you are in the stadium. Please go to the accessible turnstiles for disabled people.

Audio-descriptive commentary

An audio-descriptive commentary service will be available in the stadiums in Grenoble, Lyon, Paris and Reims. This service will be in French only. For the stadiums in Grenoble, Lyon and Reims, spectators wishing to use this service will be able to borrow the necessary device from the “commentary and audio description” collection point. If you wish to borrow a device, you will be asked to sign a guarantee.

We ask that the devices that have kindly been made available to you are returned to the “commentary and audio description” collection point at the end of the match, as they will be used in other matches in the competition.

Changing Places Toilets

There are no changing places toilets for disabled people available in the stadiums.

Assistance dogs

Spectators who are accompanied by assistance dogs will be permitted in the stadium. Please note, however, that the stadium does not have relieving areas or water bowls. You will be asked to produce official documentation stating that your dog is an assistance dog and that all vaccinations are up to date.

Emergency procedure and first aid


Each stadium has its own emergency and evacuation procedures. Members of the security team and volunteers will be available to provide any assistance necessary to disabled people or people with limited mobility in the case of an emergency. Each stadium will have a first aid room with appropriate wayfinding signage.



FIFA WOMEN'S WORLD CUP FRANCE 2019™

In 2019, France has the honor to host the eighth edition of the FIFA Women's World Cup. From the 7 June until 7 July 2019, twenty-four qualified teams, including France as the host nation will compete to win the title. 52 matches will be played across the following nine host cities: Paris, which will host the opening match, Reims, Valenciennes, Le Havre, Rennes, Grenoble, Montpellier, Nice, where the 3rd place match will take place and Lyon, which will host the Semi-Finals and the Final.



Please be respectful towards other fans and only request Special Access Tickets if you really need them. The number of special access seats is limited due to each stadium's configuration.


Disabled spectators or spectators with limited mobility may be asked to produce proof of eligibility along with their ticket when entering the stadium. Where no proof of eligibility is produced, we reserve the right to cancel the ticket(s).

Please note that a disabled parking badge will not be accepted as proof of eligibility. For more information, you can contact our customer services at tickets@loc2019.fr or by calling + 33 (0)9 70 25 55 55 (at no additional cost).

A false declaration of disability to get a Special Access Ticket reserved for disabled people is a violation of the general terms and conditions of sale of tickets for the FIFA Women's World Cup France 2019. Accordingly, FIFA and the LOC reserve the right to cancel the tickets concerned and to take action against the offenders.

3. Getting to the stadium

3.1. Grenoble



▶ Getting to the stadium

🌐 From the airport

- 40 minutes by car

🌐 From the train station

- Take tram A (towards Échirolles) and get off at the stop Verdun – Préfecture, then make your way to the stadium which is 800m away. The closest entrance is gate G7.

or

- Take bus C1 (towards Meylan, Maupertuis) and get off at the stop Hôtel de Ville, then make your way to the stadium which is 250m away. The closest entrance is gate G7.

▶ Access to the stadium

- 🌐 You can access the stadium through gates **G2** (opposite the junction of avenue Jeanne d'Arc and avenue Valmy), **G5, G6** (West entrance) and **G7** (North entrance).

▶ Car park

- Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
- The car park's entrance is on avenue Valmy. You will be able to park in the **underground car park on level P0**.

▶ Seats


- The Stade des Alpes has seats at walkway level around the stadium.

▶ Several first aid rooms are located at concourse level; one on the corner of boulevard Jean Pain and avenue Valmy and one on the corner diagonally opposite (see diagram below).

▶ Audio description

- An audio-descriptive commentary service will be available in the stadium for blind or partially sighted people.
- If you go to Gate 7, you will be able to borrow a receiver. By attaching headphones, you will be able to enjoy the audio-descriptive commentary. You will have to return the receiver to the same place at the end of the match.

3.2. Le Havre



▶ Getting to the stadium

🌐 From the train station

- Take bus 22 (towards Parc de l'Estuaire) and get off at the stop Stade Océane (ten minutes). The closest entrance is gate B.

or

- Take the "Gare Stade Express" shuttle bus; it runs between the train station and stadium on matchdays from 18:00. It leaves from platform D and stops at "Champs Barêts". The closest entrance is gate B.

▶ Access to the stadium

- 🌐 The grounds can be accessed through entrance **E3** from the rue du Stade Océane.
- 🌐 All gates can be used except gate D.
- 🌐 The first aid rooms are on level 1 between gates B and C, and gates D and E. Two smaller first aid rooms are also available near gates A and H.


▶ Car park

- 🌐 Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
- 🌐 You can park in **P6**. The gates closest to the car park are **GC** and **GE**.

▶ Seats

- 🌐 The Stade Océane seats are at walkway level around the stadium

3.3. Lyon



▶ Getting to the stadium

🌐 From the airport

- Take the tram "Rhône express" and get off at the stop Meyzieu Z.I. Then take tram 3 from Meyzieu Z.I. and get off at the stop Décines Grand Large. Then take bus 85 from Décines Grand Large and get off at the stop Parc Olympique Lyonnais. The closest gates are A, B and Z.

🌐 From the train station Lyon Part Dieu

- Take tram 3 (towards Meyzieu Les Panettes) and get off at the stop Décines Grand Large. Take bus 85 from Décines Grand Large and get off at the stop Parc Olympique Lyonnais. The closest gates are A, B and Z.

▶ Access to the stadium

- 🌐 The grounds can be accessed through entrances **E1** and **E2** (avenue Simone Veil, North side), **E3** and **E4** (rue Marceau, South side) and **E5** (South-West side).
- 🌐 All gates have barrier-free access.
- 🌐 The first aid rooms are at concourse level at gates Y, S, L and E.

▶ Car park

- 🌐 Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.

- The barrier-free car parks are **P1** and **P3**. They can be accessed from rue Marceau. The grounds can be accessed from the car park using entrances **E3** and **E4**.
 - The closest gates to the stadium are P, M and N. There are lifts to access the walkways in order to reach your seat.
- ▶ Seats
- The Stade de Lyon seats are at walkway level around the stadium.
- ▶ Audio description
- An audio-descriptive commentary service will be available in the stadium for blind or partially sighted people.
 - By going to gate C on the same level as the *bureau des litiges* (customer service offices), you will be able to get a receiver. By attaching headphones, you will be able to enjoy the audio-descriptive commentary. You will have to return the receiver to the same place at the end of the match.

3.4. Montpellier



- ▶ Getting to the stadium
- From the airport
 - Take the airport shuttle 120 and get off at the stop Place de l'Europe. Take tram 1 and get off at the stop Stade de la Mosson (one hour). The closest gate is GD.
 - From the train station

The closest train station is Montpellier Saint Roch in the city centre. You can take trams 1 and 3 to reach the Mosson stadium from the train station.

 - Take line 3 (towards Juvignac) and get off at the stop Mosson, then make your way to the stadium which is 900m away (37 minutes). The closest gate is GD.

or

- Take line 1 and get off at the stop Mosson, then make your way towards the stadium which is 600m away (45 minutes). The closest gate is GD.

▶ Access to the stadium

- The grounds can be accessed through entrances GC and GD which are on rue de Liège.
- Entrance GA, at 570 avenue de Heidelberg, is only for Amenity seats.
- The first aid rooms are at concourse level at gate D and sectors H and I.


▶ Car park

- Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
- The special access car park is at level P5.
- It can be accessed from rue de Liège, 30m from the stadium entrance.

▶ Seats

- There are Standard Easy Access / Easy Access Amenity seats located in the Haut Languedoc stand, which can be accessed from gate A. There is also accessible seating on level 1 of the Étang de Thau and Gevaudan stands (concourse level).

3.5. Nice



▶ Getting to the stadium

• From the airport

- Take shuttle bus 98 or 99 and get off at the stop Aéroport/Promenade. Then take bus 59 (towards Plan-du-Var) and get off at the stop Saint-Isidore. The closest gates are A and L.

or

- Take tram L2 (towards Magnan) and get off at the stop Cassin/Kirchner. Then make your way to the bus stop Léon Bertrand 300m away. Take bus 11 and get off at the stop Petit Pont. The closest gates are D, E and F.

 From the train station

- Take bus 12 (towards Vittone) and get off at Gambetta/Promenade. Then take bus 59 (towards Plan-du-Var) and get off at the stop Saint-Isidore. The stop is 400m from the stadium. The closest gates are A and L.

▶ Access to the stadium

-  The grounds can be accessed through entrance E1 (rue du Sapin on the West side) and E3 (rue Jules Bianchi on the North side).
-  All the gates allow barrier-free access.
-  First aid rooms are located on the concourse between gates L and K, K and J, C and D, and F and G.


▶ Car park

-  Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
-  There is an **underground** car park; level P0 which has spaces available to you.

▶ Seats

-  The Stade de Nice seats are located throughout the stadium.

3.6. Paris



▶ Getting to the stadium

📍 From the TGV train stations

Paris has six TGV stations (TGV are France's high-speed trains). From them, you can get to the Parc des Princes using public transport, or by taxi or car.

- From **Saint-Lazare** train station

Take bus 32 (towards Porte d'Auteuil) from Pasquier-Anjou and get off at Porte d'Auteuil or take bus 22 (towards Porte de Saint-Cloud) from Pasquier-Anjou and get off at Porte de Saint-Cloud.

- From **Gare du Nord**

Take RER D to Châtelet-les-Halles and then bus 72 (towards Parc de Saint-Cloud) from Rivoli-Pont Neuf and get off at Saint-Cloud-Murat.

- From **Gare de l'Est**

Take bus 32 (towards Porte d'Auteuil) from Gare de l'Est and get off at Porte d'Auteuil.

- From **Gare de Lyon**

Take RER A to Châtelet-les-Halles and then bus 72 (towards Parc de Saint-Cloud) from Rivoli-Pont Neuf and get off at Saint-Cloud-Murat.

- From **Gare d'Austerlitz**

Take bus 24 (towards Gare Saint-Lazare) and get off at Concorde. From Concorde, take bus 72 (towards Parc de Saint-Cloud) and get off at Porte de Saint-Cloud-Murat.

- From **Gare Montparnasse**

Take bus 88 (towards Hôpital Européen Georges Pompidou) from Montparnasse 2 - Gare TGV and get off at Javel. Then take bus 72 (towards Parc de Saint-Cloud) from Mirabeau and get off at Porte de Saint-Cloud-Murat.

- From the airport

- From **Paris-Charles de Gaulle**

Take RER B to Châtelet-les-Halles, then take bus 72 (towards Parc de Saint-Cloud) and get off at Porte de Saint-Cloud-Murat.

- From **Orly**

Take the OrlyBus and get off at Alésia-René Coty, then take bus 62 (towards Porte de Saint-Cloud) from René Coty and get off at Porte de Saint-Cloud.

- From **Paris-Beauvais**

A shuttle bus runs regularly between Paris-Beauvais and Paris, Porte Maillot. It takes about one hour 15 minutes and tickets can be bought online at <https://www.aeroportparisbeauvais.com/en/acces-et-transports/navettes/>

From Porte Maillot, take bus PC1 from the stop Porte Maillot - Palais des Congrès and get off at Lycée Claude Bernard.

- ▶ Access to the stadium

- The grounds can be accessed through entrances GC and GD at the junction of rue du Sergent Maginot and avenue du Parc des Princes.
- Gates C and D allow barrier-free access.
- First aid rooms are on level 1 of the stadium near gates A, G, J and M/N.

- ▶ Audio description

- An audio-descriptive commentary service will be available in the stadium for blind or partially sighted people.
- Tune in to 107.9 FM and you will be able to enjoy the audio-descriptive commentary from your phone or radio receiver.


- ▶ Car park

- Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
- You can access car park level P2 from rue du Sergent Maginot.

- ▶ Seats

- The Parc des Princes seating is located mainly in the Paris stand.

3.7. Reims



- ▶ Getting to the stadium
 - 🌐 From the train station
 - Take bus 02 (towards Cormontreuil) from Gare Centre and get off at Bocquaine, from there make your way to the stadium, which is 350m away. The closest gate is gate A.
 - or
 - Take tram B (towards Gare Champagne TGV) and get off at either Courlancy or Comédie. From the stop Comédie, the closest gate is gate C. The stop Courlancy is equidistant to gates A and C.
 - or
 - Take tram A (towards Hôpital Debré) and get off at Courlancy or Comédie. From the stop Comédie, the closest gate is gate C. The stop Courlancy is equidistant to gates A and C.

- ▶ Access to the stadium
 - 🌐 You can enter the grounds through entrances E1, E2 and E4 (from chaussée Bocquaine).
 - 🌐 First aid rooms are located on the concourse, between gates F and H and on the corners of the BATTEUX and MÉANO stands.

- ▶ Audio description
 - 🌐 An audio-descriptive commentary service will be available in the stadium for blind or partially sighted people.
 - 🌐 More information about where to collect the receiver will be provided at the stadium. By attaching headphones, you will be able to enjoy the audio-descriptive commentary. You will have to return the receiver to the same place at the end of the match.

- ▶ Car park
 - ⊗ Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
 - ⊗ Car park level P1 is barrier-free. You can access this level from the Jonquet stand and from the chaussée Bocquaine.
 - ⊗ The grounds can be accessed through entrances E1 and E2. The closest gate to the main entrance is gate A.
- ▶ Seats
 - ⊗ The Stade Auguste Delaune has accessible seating located throughout the stadium.


3.8. Rennes



- ▶ Getting to the stadium
 - ⊗ Take bus 57 (towards Rennes République) from the stop Aire Libre at the airport and get off at République. Then take bus 11 (towards Z.I. Ouest) and get off at Roazhon Park. The closest gate is gate 11.
- ▶ From the train station: take bus 11 (towards Z.I. Ouest) and get off at Roazhon Park (20 minutes). The closest gate is gate 11.
- ▶ Access to the stadium
 - ⊗ The grounds can be accessed through entrance G11 on rue de Lorient, on the North side of the stadium.
 - ⊗ There are two first aid rooms, one near gate 3 and one near gate 11/12.

- ▶ Car park
 - ⦿ Access to the special access car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket.
 - ⦿ The barrier-free car park is P2 and can be reached from rue Moulin du Comte.
- ▶ Seats
 - ⦿ The Roazhon Park stadium has seats located throughout the stadium.

3.9. Valenciennes



- ▶ Getting to the stadium
 - ⦿ From the train station
 - Take bus 1 (towards Monmousseau) and get off at Ruelle Dufour, then make your way to the stadium, which is 700m away. The closest gate is gate G.
 - or
 - Take bus 103 (towards Verchain Mairie) and get off at Stade Nungesser, then make your way to the stadium, which is 500m away. The stop Stade Nungesser is between gate E (on the left of the stadium from the bus stop) and Gate K (on the right of the stadium from the bus stop).
 - or
 - Take bus 401 (towards Curgies) and get off at Ruelle Dufour, then make your way to the stadium, which is 700m away. The closest gate is gate G.

- Take tram T1 (towards Université) and get off at Nungesser. The stop Nungesser is between gate E (on the left of the stadium from the bus stop) and gate K (on the right of the stadium from the bus stop).

▶ Access to the stadium

- 🌐 The grounds can be accessed through the entrances GE, GG, GH, GI and GK.
- 🌐 All general public entrances are barrier-free.

▶ Car park

- 🌐 Access to the car park will be granted upon presentation of a parking e-ticket requested from customer services upon purchase of the Special Access Ticket. **It is located near the Nungesser stand.**
- 🌐 The special access car park is **P2 A**, and the closest gate is gate H.

▶ Seats

- 🌐 The stadium has are located at walkway level around the stadium.
