Stadium Regulations

Version 1.0

1. Purpose of these Stadium Regulations

- 1.1. These Stadium Regulations (“**Stadium Regulations**”) were prepared by Fédération Internationale de Football Association (“**FIFA**”) for the matches (“**Matches**”) of the FIFA Club World Cup Qatar 2020™ (“**Competition**”). Unless otherwise expressly authorised by FIFA, and at all times subject to applicable laws, these Stadium Regulations shall apply to all holders of a ticket, (hereinafter “**Ticket**”) or accreditation device (“**Accreditation**”) who enter the stadium premises used in connection with the Competition. Stadium premises shall include all venue areas, including all entrances and exits, as well as all other official areas and facilities (hereinafter “**Stadium**”) that are accessible with a Ticket or other admission document determined by FIFA.
- 1.2. These Stadium Regulations describe the safety measures and policies applicable for the conduct of (a) all people that are using tickets (“**Ticket Holder**”) to attend a Match and (b) all people that are using an Accreditation (“**Accredited Person**”) to gain entry to the Stadium.
- 1.3. Permission to enter or to remain within the Stadium (notwithstanding possession of a Ticket and/or Accreditation) is at the absolute discretion of FIFA.
- 1.4. These Stadium Regulations replace, for the period during which a Ticket or Accreditation is required to enter the Stadium, the Stadium’s regulations or codes applicable to other matches played and/or events organised in the Stadium during other periods not connected to the Competition.
- 1.5. FIFA, Qatar 2022 Local Organising Committee LLC (“**LOC**”), the Competition ticketing agent, the Stadium management, police, law-enforcement officials, and/or public authority(-ies) and their respective employees, volunteers, agents, representatives, officers and directors are responsible for safety and security in connection with the Matches, (such parties – each being responsible for its own acts and omissions – collectively the “**Authorities**”).

2. Acceptance of these Stadium Regulations at the Stadium by Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons

- 2.1. FIFA reserves the right to make reasonable amendments to these Stadium Regulations. The latest and effective version of these Stadium Regulations will be available on Match days at the Stadium, online in the ‘Ticketing’ section of the Competition website, accessible via [FIFA.com/tickets](https://www.fifa.com/tickets), and may be provided to any person upon request, through the addresses indicated at the Competition website.
- 2.2. Entry to the Stadium shall constitute acceptance of these Stadium Regulations as well as any specific instructions given by the relevant Authorities. In cases where it is considered necessary, besides these Stadium Regulations, other mandatory instructions may be given by any Authority, aiming to prevent or eliminate any risk to life, health or personal possessions and assure safety at the Stadium.

3. Stadium Entrance

- 3.1. Access to the Stadium is only permitted upon presentation of one valid Ticket for the relevant Match, QID/passport or Accreditation per person regardless of his/her age (including children) and upon successfully passing the search and screening procedures. The Ticket or Accreditation shall be retained by Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons during their entire stay in the Stadium and shall be submitted for inspection at the entrance and inside the Stadium at the request of the relevant Authorities at any time. An official identification document must be produced upon request. In the event of non-cooperation, access to the Stadium will be refused or the person will be removed from the Stadium without the right to claim a refund.
- 3.2. Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons are required to present and carry a personalised identification document such as a passport or a Qatar Identity card for the purpose of accessing a Stadium. FIFA and the LOC do not assume any liability, obligation or responsibility in respect of the application, issuance, use and any other operations related to an identification document.
- 3.3. The validity and use of Tickets or Accreditations are determined in accordance with the Competition's General Terms and Conditions for the Use of Tickets ("**GTCs**") accessible via [FIFA.com/tickets](https://www.fifa.com/tickets) and/or such other terms and conditions applicable to Accreditation. Holders of a Ticket or Accreditation may only access the Stadium if they have a Ticket or Accreditation acquired and used in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions.
- 3.4. Tickets or Accreditations acquired from illegal/unauthorised sources are deemed void and invalid. The possessor of such an item will be denied access to or removed from the Stadium, without the right to claim compensation, and may be prosecuted, as set forth in the GTCs and the Ticket Sales Regulations applicable to the respective Ticket Holder ("**TSRs**").
- 3.5. Holders of Tickets for disabled people and people with limited mobility ("**Accessibility Tickets**") may be requested to provide proof of eligibility necessary for the purchase or use of the Accessibility Ticket at the entrance and inside the Stadium at any time.
- 3.6. Accessibility Tickets for persons requiring a wheelchair or mobility scooter ("**Wheelchair User Places**") grant such ticket holders access to and within the Stadium only with their own wheelchair or mobility scooter (to the exclusion of any other type of seating). A Wheelchair User Place provides for a space free of obstacles for the wheelchair or mobility scooter that is brought to the Stadium by the Wheelchair User Place Ticket Holder. Manual or electric wheelchairs or scooters that have either 3 or 4 wheels with maximum dimensions of 70 centimetres in width and 130 centimetres in length and a maximum turning radius of 90 centimetres and maximum turning width of 150 centimetres with a maximum speed of 6 kilometres per hour are permitted. Larger wheelchairs or scooters may not fit in the allocated wheelchair user place and may not allow its user to access all areas such as lifts and toilets. Due to security and operational restrictions, wheelchairs or any other type of seating will not be provided to Wheelchair User Place Ticket Holders. Stadium access shall be granted to Holders of companion Tickets upon verification that they accompany the Accessibility Ticket Holder to whom such companion Ticket corresponds.
- 3.7. Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons agree and recognise that their access is restricted to the areas of the Stadium specified on the Ticket or Accreditation or in accordance with what is instructed by the relevant Authorities.

- 3.8. If a Ticket Holder is not 18 years old at the time of admission to the Stadium, his/her parents, guardians or accompanying tutors are responsible for their actions, in addition to complying with the terms and conditions of these Stadium Regulations, all applicable procedures and policies of the LOC as well as all specific instructions given by the relevant Authorities.
- 3.9. Driving and parking of vehicles into and inside the Stadium is only permitted with the special authorisation of the relevant Authorities.
- 3.10. There is no re-admission to the Stadium unless otherwise approved by the relevant Authorities.
- 3.11. The Authorities are authorised to examine – including through the use of technical aids – whether persons represent a security risk, in particular whether they have consumed alcohol or drugs or are in possession of items, which could harm, injure, endanger or unnecessarily obstruct others or cause damage to anything, such as the ‘Prohibited Items’ detailed in Section 4 below.
- 3.12. PERSONS WHO MAKE UNAUTHORISED USE OF TICKETS OR ACCREDITATION, DO NOT FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN BY THE RELEVANT AUTHORITIES, ARE DEEMED TO REPRESENT A SECURITY RISK, OR WHO ARE SUBJECT TO A LOCAL, NATIONAL OR FOREIGN STADIUM BAN, WILL BE DENIED ACCESS TO OR REMOVED FROM THE STADIUM, WITHOUT THE RIGHT TO CLAIM A REFUND PURSUANT TO THE GTCS, AND MAY BE PROSECUTED.
- 3.13. Spectators must wear a facemask at all times (an additional face shield will be provided at entry to the stadium and must be worn along with the face mask for additional protection)

4. Prohibited Items

- 4.1. The following items are strictly prohibited at all times in the Stadium, unless otherwise expressly authorised by FIFA and/or the LOC, where appropriate, such as in accordance with the applicable Accreditation terms and conditions:
 - 4.1.1. weapons of any kind (including for self-defence), ammunition or components of guns, piercing or bladed items, knives, cold steel weapons or objects which enable the practice of violence;
 - 4.1.2. explosives, detonators and items containing or concealing such prohibited items;
 - 4.1.3. any other object likely to be used as a weapon, to cut, or to stab, or as a projectile, or any object endangering the safety of others, including long umbrellas or beach umbrellas, ‘selfie’ sticks, motorcycle helmets, hard hats and other similar objects;
 - 4.1.4. bottles, cups (except plastic cups), jars, cans or any other form of closed receptacle, of any kind, that may be thrown or cause injuries, as well as other objects made of glass or any other fragile material, fragmentable or especially hard, Tetrapak packages or hard thermal boxes;
 - 4.1.5. liquids of any kind in containers larger than 100 millilitres (except baby milk and sterilised water in containers, including in glass containers, not exceeding 1 litre per child), unless if purchased inside of the Stadium, in plastic cups, and in accordance with the safety procedures applicable to the Competition. Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited in all cases;
 - 4.1.6. any materials, articles or objects (including self-made items) the use of which can result in the generation of smoke, heat and/or flames including fireworks, flares, smoke bombs and other

- smoke-emitting articles, compressed and liquefied gases, combustible solids, poisonous or noxious or pungent substances, oxidising substances and organic peroxides;
- 4.1.7. toxic, radioactive, caustic or corrosive materials;
 - 4.1.8. spray cans, corrosive and flammable substances, paints or receptacles containing substances that are harmful to health or highly flammable. Common cigarette pocket lighters and matches are also prohibited.
 - 4.1.9. aerosol cylinders, thermoses and flasks of any kind;
 - 4.1.10. radio-electronic or high frequency devices, or any other devices that may lead to an interruption or failure of broadcasting or IT functionality at the Stadium;
 - 4.1.11. food items of any kind (including chewing gum), except if acquired inside the Stadium or if they are medically required or for babies or young infants (not exceeding 1 litre per child). Food items required for medical reasons will only be permitted entry to the Stadium on production of a medical certificate and in the presence of the person for whom they are intended. Any permitted food items must be packed in receptacles that are not made out of glass;
 - 4.1.12. drugs, narcotics or stimulants of any kind (except substances necessary for medical reasons on production of medical certificates and in the presence of the person for whom they are intended). Medical drugs not prohibited or restricted by Qatari law are permitted in quantities not exceeding a single package of more than 7 different medicines (in any form, including aerosols, drops, syringes, etc.) and in factory packaging;
 - 4.1.13. any materials of a political, offensive and/or discriminatory nature, containing wording, symbols or any other attributes aimed at discrimination of any kind against a country, private person or group on account of race, colour of skin, ethnic, national or social origin, gender, disability, language, religion, political opinion or any other opinion, wealth, birth or any other status, sexual orientation or any other reason, including but not limited to banners, flags, fliers, apparel and other paraphernalia;
 - 4.1.14. flagpoles or banner poles of any kind. Only flexible poles or so called double poles made from non-flammable plastic and not exceeding 1 metre long and 1 centimetre in diameter are permitted;
 - 4.1.15. flags and posters except those not exceeding 2 meters x 1.5 meters , provided such flags or posters are made of material considered non-flammable, and are not in any other way prohibited under these Stadium Regulations. All such items must be presented at the Stadium entrance for inspection by the Authorities;
 - 4.1.16. any type of animal, except for assistance dogs that are permitted under local laws, provided they are not considered dangerous animals under the Dangerous Animals Act. Assistance dogs shall only be permitted if they are accompanying a disabled spectator with an Accessibility Ticket or a disabled Accredited Person. The relevant Authorities shall have the ultimate decision to determine whether any animal be permitted inside the Stadium.
 - 4.1.17. any promotional or commercial object, apparel or other material, including, but not limited to, banners, flags, signs, symbols and flyers or any type of object, material or clothes that, in the opinion of any of the Authorities, are promotional or commercial in nature;
 - 4.1.18. inflatable balls and projectiles of any kind, regardless of the size, as well as any sports equipment (excluding clothing), including bicycles, rollerblades, skateboards, kick scooters, Frisbees, etc.;
 - 4.1.19. large objects such as stairs, benches, folding chairs, boxes, cardboard containers, large bags, backpacks, suitcases and sports bags. 'Large' means any objects in which the sum of three dimensions of length, width and height exceeds 75 centimetres and which cannot be stored under a seat in the Stadium;

- 4.1.20. large quantities of paper and/or rolls of paper;
 - 4.1.21. electronic, mechanical or manual instruments and/or devices producing noise larger than 120 centimetres in three dimensions and those that produce excessively loud sounds (including vuvuzelas). Ticket Holders may be required by the Authorities to stop using such devices if the sound interferes with event operations or the enjoyment of other Ticket Holders;
 - 4.1.22. instruments that emit laser beams, laser pointers or similar instruments;
 - 4.1.23. large quantities of powder, flour or similar substances;
 - 4.1.24. any type of television and telecommunication equipment (including professional video cameras) or other professional equipment that is capable of recording sound and video;
 - 4.1.25. more than one set of extra batteries or rechargeable units for any device which is permitted under these Stadium Regulations;
 - 4.1.26. mounts for photo and video equipment with three supports (e.g. tripods) or one support (e.g. monopods and selfie sticks);
 - 4.1.27. drones and any remote-controlled aircraft;
 - 4.1.28. body protection gear including bullet-proof vests, gear used in martial arts or extreme sports, or corsets;
 - 4.1.29. masks, helmets, as well as any other means of disguise or items specifically designed for concealing the person's identification, except for religious headwear; and
 - 4.1.30. other objects that may compromise public safety, cause nuisance and/or harm the Competition's reputation, as determined by the Authorities at their discretion.
- 4.2. THE LIST REFERRED TO IN SECTION 4.1 ABOVE IS NOT EXHAUSTIVE. IN CASE OF DOUBT REGARDING AN ITEM BROUGHT TO OR INTO THE STADIUM, THE COMPETENT PERSON(S) DESIGNATED BY FIFA AND/OR THE LOC SHALL DECIDE WHETHER THE ITEM IS PROHIBITED OR AUTHORISED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE STADIUM REGULATIONS.
- 4.3. Special rules may apply to Accredited Persons. Further information for dedicated groups shall be available at each Stadium entry point.

5. Behaviour at the Stadium

- 5.1. All persons entering the Stadium must:
- 5.1.1. conduct themselves in a way that does not cause harm, injury, danger, unnecessary obstruction, alarm or discomfort to others, and does not cause any damage;
 - 5.1.2. follow the instructions of Authorities, or the police, firefighters or other emergency services;
 - 5.1.3. access only the Stadium zones which are specified on their Tickets or Accreditation and occupy only the category indicated on their Ticket, or the determined location by the function for which they hold an Accreditation, and they must access it only by the entrance designated, unless instructed differently by the relevant Authorities. Ticket Holders shall only sit in their designated seats during their stay in the Stadium. For reasons of safety and to avoid danger, Ticket Holders shall change seats that are not their designated or occupied seats, being of the same sector of the Stadium or otherwise, if they are instructed to do so by the relevant Authorities;
 - 5.1.4. deposit waste and empty packaging in the rubbish bins and containers provided in the Stadium. If the Stadium has a selective waste sorting (e.g. recycling) system, it must be respected;

- 5.1.5. wear face masks at all times;
 - 5.1.6. immediately take the necessary steps to inform the Authorities, or a police officer, if a person is aware of any damage caused to any property or an accident in or immediately surrounding the Stadium; and
 - 5.1.7. comply with lawful requests from the representatives of FIFA, the LOC and the Authorities
- 5.2. Exceptional measures may be taken to prevent, limit or eliminate any danger of death or any risk to health or property. The instructions given by the Authorities, or the police, firefighters or other emergency services must be followed. Non-cooperation will result in removal from the Stadium.
- 5.3. In addition, unless authorised by the relevant Authorities (such as, where appropriate, in accordance with the Accreditation terms and conditions and/or as specifically permitted by way of Accreditation), Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons must not (it being understood that the following list is not exhaustive):
- 5.3.1. enter the field of play or areas immediately surrounding the field of play;
 - 5.3.2. stand on their seats in the spectator areas or unreasonably obstruct the vision of other Ticket Holders in any way;
 - 5.3.3. throw objects, substances or liquids of any kind, in particular towards another person or in the direction of the field of play or the area around the field of play;
 - 5.3.4. start a fire, release or throw fireworks, flares, guns, bombs and other smoke devices and pyrotechnic devices, or other devices that produce similar effects;
 - 5.3.5. practise conduct that may interfere with the comfort, safety or enjoyment of the Competition for any other Ticket Holder, Accredited Person, player or Match official, or that may disrupt the sporting nature of the Competition;
 - 5.3.6. act in a manner that may be perceived as dangerous, provocative, threatening, offensive and/or discriminatory;
 - 5.3.7. possess, use, display, disseminate, promote or transmit any materials of a political, offensive and/or discriminatory nature, containing wording, symbols or any other attributes aimed at discrimination of any kind against a country, private person or group on account of race, colour of skin, ethnic, national or social origin, gender, disability, language, religion, political opinion or any other opinion, wealth, birth or any other status, sexual orientation or any other reason, including but not limited to banners, flags, fliers, symbols, apparel and other paraphernalia;
 - 5.3.8. be visibly under the influence of alcohol, narcotics or any narcotic substance. Alcohol may only be consumed in moderation and always in accordance with Qatari legislation in respect to age limits and other restrictions. Alcohol must not be offered to persons under the legal drinking age;
 - 5.3.9. bother or harass any other person, including players and officials involved in the Match;
 - 5.3.10. curse or chant in a political, offensive and/or discriminatory manner;
 - 5.3.11. smoke, vape or use any tobacco product as well as any electronic smoking device in the Stadium, except in 'Designated Smoking Areas' (if they are made available);
 - 5.3.12. secure flags and banners to surfaces of structures and installations at the Stadium or otherwise use flags for any reason other than in a festive and friendly manner;
 - 5.3.13. sell or offer to sell goods or Tickets, gather and/or distribute materials (including printed materials such as flyers, booklets and publications, advertising materials and apparel) or any objects whatsoever, raise funds or conduct other promotional or commercial activities without the prior written consent of FIFA (including demonstrating discernible brands or trademarks

- of legal entities or individuals for advertising purposes) nor conduct any other types of promotional or propaganda activities;
- 5.3.14. create any threat to life to oneself or others, or hurt any person in any way;
 - 5.3.15. promote any violent or damaging behaviour, or behave oneself, or demonstrate tendency to behave oneself in a violent and harmful manner or one that may disturb the public order;
 - 5.3.16. disrupt the operation of Stadium utilities, including power supply, lighting (including emergency lighting), ventilation, water supply, sewage, air conditioning, and any other systems;
 - 5.3.17. damage vegetation, cultural or natural heritage sites;
 - 5.3.18. climb structures and installations prohibited for general use, notably closed fences, walls, wire fences, barriers, light poles, camera platforms, trees, pools of any type or roof tops;
 - 5.3.19. restrict, obstruct or block passages, gangways, staircases and streets, entrances and exits to the Stadium, seating areas and emergency exits, or obstruct or interfere with open zones to traffic, or otherwise act in a way that could cause crowding in a manner that creates a risk of a stampede or public disturbance;
 - 5.3.20. access, or facilitate access for others to, areas that are closed to the public or to which access is not authorised (except with a valid Ticket, Accreditation or other access device) such as the operations rooms, VIP rooms, press rooms, etc.;
 - 5.3.21. write, paint or post anything on structural elements, installations or passages;
 - 5.3.22. relieve oneself in any place other than the toilets, or litter in the Stadium by dropping objects such as trash, packaging, empty containers, etc.;
 - 5.3.23. solicit donations in cash or in kind (including but not limited to musicians, singers or collectors of charitable donations at the Stadium entrance or on Stadium premises) without authorisation from the Authorities;
 - 5.3.24. conduct any activities relating to gambling, betting, court siding, including wagering of money or value-in-kind on an event and/or match with an uncertain outcome, with the primary intent of winning money or material goods;
 - 5.3.25. conduct any activities related to predicting or attempting to predict sport results with potential financial profit, relaying and/or transmitting, via mobile devices, the live scores or any activity related to the Competition or any Match on the field of play or information about Match activities that is announced via the public address system and/or giant screens located within the Stadium;
 - 5.3.26. As per the "FIFA Club World Cup Qatar 2020, health care protocol, use devices that generate noise or that may force people to lean in closer or raise their voices to be heard and can interfere with the playing or viewing of Matches, excluding devices approved by the Authorities as being intended for expressing support for football teams and players;
 - 5.3.27. use clothing items, including masks, to conceal the face, as well as using any other means of contrivance aimed at obstructing personal identification, except for mandatory face masks and national and religious headwear;
 - 5.3.28. bring to, or store at, the Stadium any items prohibited under these Stadium Regulations; and practise other activities that may compromise the public safety and/or harm the reputation of the Competition, as determined by FIFA, the LOC and/or any other person legally authorised to make such determination.

6. Recording and transmission of sounds and images

- 6.1. Each person attending a Match shall be deemed to have given his or her irrevocable consent (or, where the person is a minor, his/her representative shall be deemed to have given his/her irrevocable consent)

on a worldwide, perpetual basis to the use by FIFA, the LOC or its designees, for commercial purposes or otherwise, free of charge or any compensation, of his or her voice, image and likeness in live or recorded video display, broadcast or other transmission or recording, photographs, or any other media now or hereafter existing, taken or recorded in connection with the Competition. In this regard, each person attending a Match shall be deemed to have waived on an irrevocable, worldwide, perpetual basis, to the greatest extent permitted by applicable laws, all rights to object to such recording and broadcasting, transmission or other dissemination thereof in any current and/or future media technologies and all rights in connection with the copyright and any other intellectual property rights of any nature whatsoever in and to any recordings of sound or images taken in connection with the Competition.

- 6.2. Except as expressly permitted by FIFA (for example, by way of an Accreditation), all persons attending a Match are prohibited from recording, transmitting, or in any other manner disseminating over any media (including, without limitation, all forms of television, radio, the internet, mobile devices, newsletter or newspaper) any image (whether in the form of still, moving or rapid sequence pictures), sound, text or description or result of any Match of the Competition, in whole or in part, and from assisting any other person(s) in the conduct of such activities, other than for private, non-commercial use.
- 6.3. All copyright, database rights and any other intellectual property rights in any recording and/or transmission that is not expressly permitted under Section 6.2 is assigned (by way of present assignment of future rights) to FIFA. Any such person to whom this Section 6.3 applies shall (if and whenever required to do so by the Authorities) promptly execute all instruments and do all things necessary to vest the right, title and interest in such rights to FIFA absolutely and free of all encumbrances and other charges.

7. Breach of these rules

- 7.1. Subject to applicable laws, any breach of these rules may result in the following sanctions being applied:
 - 7.1.1. expulsion from the Stadium and being handed over to the police;
 - 7.1.2. banning of the offender from all Stadiums for all or part of the duration of the Competition, in accordance with the applicable Accreditation terms and conditions or the GTCs, as applicable;
 - 7.1.3. cancellation and invalidation of the Ticket and any other Ticket purchased by the offender for the Match in question or for other Matches, in accordance with the GTCs;
 - 7.1.4. provision of the offender's personal information to national football associations and/or the police, in accordance with applicable laws, so that appropriate measures can be taken (for example, national stadium bans);
 - 7.1.5. initiation of legal proceedings by FIFA and/or the LOC, or by any other authorised person or entity;
 - 7.1.6. any other penalty or other recourse, in accordance with applicable Qatari law.
- 7.2. FIFA and/or the LOC reserve the right to undertake any other judicial action at their sole discretion.

8. Liability

- 8.1. All persons entering the Stadium expressly acknowledge and agree that in entering the Stadium, there could be an increased risk of exposure to the COVID-19 or other pandemic, for which such persons fully accept the personal and any related risks and fully waive, to the extent permitted by law, any and all claims for liability, costs, expenses, harm, loss and/or damage from FIFA and/or the LOC.
- 8.2. All persons entering the Stadium, to the fullest extent permitted by law:
- 8.2.1. acknowledge that they assume any and all liability, including but not limited to damages or losses, including transmission of Covid-19 to other persons in the Stadium, resulting from their behaviour in the Stadium;
 - 8.2.2. waive any and all claims for liability, costs, expenses, harm, loss and/or damage from FIFA or the LOC in connection with their behaviour in the Stadium; and
 - 8.2.3. unconditionally agree to indemnify and hold harmless FIFA and/or the LOC from any liability, costs, expenses, demands, loss and/or damage of whatever nature arising in connection with their behaviour in the Stadium.

9. Severability of these Stadium Regulations and modifications

- 9.1. Should an individual provision of these Stadium Regulations be void, invalid or unenforceable, the validity of the remainder of these Stadium Regulations will not be affected and will remain in full force and effect.
- 9.2. In the event that FIFA and/or the LOC amend these Stadium Regulations in accordance with Section 2.1, persons who have requested Tickets or Accreditations shall receive an email at the address they communicated at the time of their request (subject to one-off modifications, in accordance with the corresponding terms and conditions) informing them of the publication of the new version. It will then be their responsibility to transmit this information to the holders or potential holders of the Tickets or the Accreditations for whom they have submitted a request.

10. Governing version

- 10.1. These Stadium Regulations shall be made available in both Arabic and English. In the event of discrepancies between the translations, the English version shall govern.

11. Applicable law and legal force

- 11.1. These Stadium Regulations and their interpretation are governed by the laws of Qatar.
- 11.2. Any dispute arising out of or in connection to these regulations shall be submitted to the competent courts of Qatar.
